### Inhalation

# **Extinguishing Media**

### Suitable Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, appropriate foam, water spray or fog.

### **Unsuitable Extinguishing Media**

Do not use high volume water jet, as this may spread the fire.

### Specific Hazards Arising from the Product

Flammable liquid and vapour. Can ignite at room temperature. Releases vapour that can form explosive mixture with air. Even dilute solutions in water may be flammable. See Section 9 (Physical and Chemical Properties) for flash point and explosive limits. Heating increases the release of toxic vapour. Closed containers may rupture violently when heated releasing contents.

In a fire, the following hazardous materials may be generated: very toxic carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide; toxic chemicals; irritating chemicals.

## **Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters**

Evacuate area. Fight fire from a safe distance or a protected location. Use water spray to dilute spills to non-flammable mixtures. Use water spray to flush spills away from ignition sources. Do NOT apply water directly to spill. Stop leak before attempting to put out the fire. Product could form an explosive mixture and reignite. If the leak cannot be stopped, let the fire burn itself out.

Knock down vapours or gases with water fog or fine water spray.

Before entry, especially into confined areas, use an appropriate monitor to check for: toxic gases or vapours, flammable or explosive atmosphere.

Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal.

Fire-fighters may enter the area if positive pressure SCBA and full Bunker Gear is worn.

# Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Emergency responders: get expert advice. Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Eliminate all ignition sources if safe to do so. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials. Before entry, especially into confined areas, check atmosphere with an appropriate monitor.

### Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

# **SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE**

## **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Obtain special instructions before use. Avoid breathing in this product. Avoid repeated or prolonged skin contact. Do not get in eyes. Do not swallow. Avoid generating vapours or mists. Prevent uncontrolled release of product. Immediately report leaks, spills or failures of the safety equipment (e.g. ventilation system). Eliminate heat and ignition sources such as sparks, open flames, hot surfaces and static discharge. Post "No Smoking" signs. Do not spray on an open flame or other ignition source. Do not pierce or burn container, even after use. Avoid heating that will increase the amount of vapours. Do not weld, cut or perform hot work on empty container until all traces of product have been removed. Use non-sparking tools. Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical.

Properly vent drums to prevent pressure buildup. Do not handle swollen drums. Contact supervisor for advice. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use or empty. Do not use at elevated temperatures without a thorough safety assessment.

# **Conditions for Safe Storage**
